

Annual Report Filed by May 31

Contains data from previous year



Reports inform fee setting process



Invoices issued in January

- 2022 report is based on 2021 data;
- Informs 2023 invoices



Stewardship Ontario's Simplified Fees

- Recommendation for proposed simplified approach to fee setting submitted to RPRA
- If approved, would eliminate need for most stewards to submit material report in 2022 and future years
- Watch for announcements from SO and RPRA



Recycle BC: 2022 Reporting

- Milk and plant-based Beverage Container joined the Deposit system February 2022
- Solvent, flammables and pesticide containers
- 2022 Report (2021 data) 2023 invoice will include reporting on Single-Use Products/Packaging-Like Products (SUP/PLP)
- Service Packaging changes affects obligated steward



Recycle BC: SUP/PLP

Regulatory amendments announced in 2020 designated product materials beginning in 2023 – must be reported in 2022

Packaging Like Product (PLP)

Moving boxes, recycling bags...

Single Use Product (SUP)

Straws, plastic cutlery...

Recycle BC: Service Packaging

- Service packaging includes all bags, boxes and other items for the containment of goods at point-of-sale
- The obligation for unbranded service packaging will shift to the resident brand owner, first importer or franchisor in BC
- Branded packaging remains to be the responsibility of the brand owner
- Retailers will still be obligated for any service packaging that remains branded with the filler's logo or is pre-packaged in advance

Vendor Review - Checklist for Retailers

- ✓ Have you reviewed your internal records to see where they have residency?
- ✓ Have you requested confirmation from your vendor of their residency status in each program?
- ✓ Have you conducted a preliminary review against the Steward List?
- ✓ Have you conducted an internet-based search for alternate names that vendor may have, a parent company they could be under, or other physical addresses in other provinces?
- ✓ Have you applied an additional lens on the brands those remaining vendors are supplying you with?

Vendor Review - Steward Lists

- Steward Lists make it easier for retailers and other first importers to exclude suppliers' products from their reports
- Steward lists and Change Logs are published every
 January under the Reporting Resources page
- If supplier not on list but resident in reporting province, do not include their material in your report

Vendor Review - Internet Searches

Are they operating under a different name?

Are they under a parent company?


- Does that parent company have residency in that province or are they registered as a voluntary steward?
- Can you locate an address for this vendor in any of the provinces where you are obligated to report?



Vendor Review - Brand Analysis

- Important analysis if you are procuring your products from distributors and third-party suppliers (and not directly from brand owners)
- Review the brands that vendor supplies you with
 - Are those brands under a parent company who is an obligated steward or has registered as a voluntary steward with the programs?

Brand Owner Reporting Challenges




The biggest challenge brand owners face is determining where their products are ending up versus where they are shipping them.

Lose line of sight after initial sale.

Programs require data to show where the product's end of life management is being managed




Select which year you would like to report for. Note that you will only be able to select years where one or more programs are available for reporting. A program is available for reporting in a year where:

- · You have confirmed your obligation as obligated or voluntary
- · You have not confirmed not obligated
- · You do not already have a report in progress

2022 Report (2021 data, 2023 invoice)

Reporting Preferences

- Multi-Program report allows filing for all programs at once
- The WeRecycle Material List is recommended as it is harmonized across all 4 PPP programs
- Multiple divisions will allow you to split your tonnage into separate sections



Entering Material Quantities

- Use the cells to enter quantities for the applicable materials
- Columns for each program if you are filing a multiprogram report
- No decimal places; whole numbers only

Completing your Methodology

All methodology sections must be completed before your report can be submitted. This includes:


- 1. Preparation of Data Explain your methodology
- 2. Methodology Changes Explain any changes since last year
- 3. Deductions did you or did you not claim deductions
- Increases and Decreases:
 - Elaborate on notable variances (20% more or less)
 - Are you reporting under different materials categories?
 - Has product mix changed?

Report Validation

- All reports are reviewed for accuracy vital for accurate invoicing and fee setting
- Validation of submitted report

Common issues include:

- Updates to brands and methodology
- Deduction review
- Explanation of material tonnage variances ±20%



Deductions vs. Exclusions

Deductions

 Supplied to consumers but does not end up in the residential waste stream



Exclusions

- Never supplied to consumers - not in the programs' scope
- IC&I
- Durable packaging
- Items that do not serve a packaging function
- Items that constitute an integral part of the product

Deduction And Exclusion Resources







DEDUCTION AND EXCLUSION POLICY

KEY FEATURES:

 This Policy provides guidance about "deductions" and" exclusions" from the Annual Steward Report.

Overview

- This Policy:
 - outlines the scope of permitted deductions in Annual Steward Reports; and
 - explains what materials must be excluded from Annual Steward Reports because they are not designated paper or packaging materials.

II. Purpose

- 2. The Policy:
 - promotes fairness and consistency for all stewards; and
 - supports stewards in their obligation to produce Annual Steward Reports which are auditable by the Program and by provincial regulators.

III. Scope

- This Policy is effective January 1, 2022 for all stewards meeting their regulatory stewardship obligations with one or more of the following paper and packaging programs (the "Programs"):
 - Recycle BC;
 - Multi-Material Stewardship Western (MMSW); and
 - Multi-Material Stewardship Manitoba (MMSM).

Stewardship Ontario (Blue Box) has a separate but identical Policy.

Applying Deductions To Your Reports

- Eligible deduction criteria:
 - Materials supplied to consumers that are not managed in the residential waste stream
 - Product returns which are not resupplied
 - Packaging removed from customer's home
- Deductions for plastic carry-out bag return-to-retail programs are only permitted in the MMSM and Ontario Blue Box programs
- Recycle BC's program includes municipal property (i.e.- streetscape, parkscape, etc.)

Deduction Validation Data

- Substantiation required
 - Completed Deduction Form
 - Copies of studies, research data and its application
 - Ensure data clearly demonstrates the % of paper and packaging managed outside of the residential waste stream
 - Refreshed at least every 5 years
