Step 1: Allocate the Gross
Cost of the recycling system

Step 2: Allocate the Commodity Revenue earned by the recycling program

Step 3: Allocate the Program
Management costs of the
stewardship program

Step 4: Allocate the Promotion & Education and/or Market Development costs



Ontario Passes New Circular Economy Legislation



- The Waste Free Ontario
 Act received Royal Assent in
 June; awaiting proclamation
- "Strategy for Waste-Free Ontario: Building the Circular Economy" expected within three months of proclamation of legislation
- SO preparing for new regulatory environment with focus on ensuring stewards remain compliant with ongoing updates on transition to new legislation

The 2017 Fee Schedule Highlights



- Continued use of three-factor formula
 - Awaiting approval from Minister of Environment & Climate Change
- Cost containment return of \$5.4M
- Surplus drawdown of \$1.2M for printed paper stewards
- Magazines & catalogues category
 - Increase of 23.5% due to a decline in supplied tonnes over which to share costs

Looking Forward: Program Plan Renewal Update

- MMSM consulted on its PP Renewal
 - Approx. 1,600 notices were sent to stewards, trade associations, municipal partners and stakeholders
 - The PP Renewal was posted on the MMSM website
 - 14 responses/comments were received
- PP Renewal was submitted to the Minister of Sustainable Development on April 29, 2016
- The PP Renewal and consultation summary are available on the MMSM website
- Public consultation period ended October 4, 2016



2016 Achievements

- MMBC expanded direct service in September 2016 with addition of City of Vancouver and Pitt Meadows
- MMBC was highlighted in 2016 New Plastic Economy report issued by Ellen MacArthur Foundation and World Economic Forum as a successful recycling program that

"...allows the province to achieve productivity previously unavailable to residential recycling programmes."



2016: Expanding On-Street Recycling Stations



City of Vancouver Transition

- CoV has been included in MMBC program since May 2014, receiving MMBC incentives for:
 - Curbside collection
 - Multi-family collection
 - 2 depots
- In November 2015, the CoV announced decision to transition responsibility for curbside and multi-family service directly to MMBC
- CoV indicated that: "MMBC has demonstrated their ability to implement recycling systems in other municipalities and have achieved high levels of recycling."
- MMBC released an RFP for collection services Dec 2015

Plastic Film and Foam Pilot with London Drugs

The one-year pilot program involves 11 stores in the City of Vancouver and will be evaluated for potential introduction in other parts of the province in the future.




Carton Campaign
